

Prepare Your Taxes with Free AARP Aide

With tax season here, prepare now with the <u>AARP</u> <u>Foundation's Tax-Aide Service</u>. The volunteer-run program helps the military community file state and federal tax returns. Trained Tax-Aide volunteers are nationwide and IRS-certified each year to ensure they understand the latest changes and additions to the tax code. Tax-Aide is free and available either virtually or in-person (by appointment only) to all Veterans, service members, and their families regardless of age or whether they are AARP members.

New Law Helps Survivors Get VA Benefits

A new law makes it easier for survivors of Veterans exposed to toxic material, including burn pits, to receive <u>Dependency and Indemnity Compensation</u> (<u>DIC</u>), tax-free benefit payments available for certain surviving spouses, children, or parents. They may also now be eligible for a <u>one-time payment for accrued benefits</u>, burial benefits, education and training, home loan certificates of eligibility, or health care

New Toxic Exposure Screening for Veterans

Veterans who enroll or are enrolled in VA health care, can now receive the toxic exposure screening at VA medical centers and clinics across the country. During your screening, if you believe you experienced toxic exposures during your military service, you may be connected to resources and encouraged to file a disability claim

Education Benefits for Survivors & Dependents

If you're the child or spouse of a Veteran or service member who has died, is captured or missing, or is rated permanently and totally disabled, you may be able to get help paying for school or job training through the Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA) program, also called Chapter 35.

"To observe a Marine is inspirational, to be a Marine is exceptional."

"Semper Fidelis" ("Always Faithful")

The motto of the Corps. That Marines have lived up to this motto is proved by the fact that there has never been a mutiny, or even the thought of one, among U.S. Marines.

Semper Fidelis was adopted about 1883 as the motto of the Corps. Before that, there had been three mottoes, all traditional rather than official. The first, antedating the War of 1812, was "Fortitudine" ("With Fortitude"). The second, "By Sea and by Land," was obviously a translation of the Royal Marine's "Per Mare, Per Terram." Until 1848, the third motto was "To the Shores of Tripoli," in commemoration of O'Bannon's capture of Derna in 1805. In 1848, after the return to Washington of the Marine battalion that took part in the capture of Mexico City, this motto was revised to: "From the Halls of the Montezumas to the Shores of Tripoli" – a line now familiar to all Americans. This revision of the Corps motto in Mexico has encouraged speculation that the first stanza of "The Marines' Hymn" was composed by members of the Marine battalion who stormed Chapultepec Castle.

It may be added that the Marine Corps shares its motto with England's Devonshire Regiment, the 11th Foot, one of the senior infantry regiments of the British Army, whose sobriquet is "the Bloody Eleventh" and whose motto is also Semper Fidelis.
